




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Welcome to Our Program

Our **Oversight Program** provides resources and information about how to get started, setting up a home school, lesson plans, grades, administrative oversight, instruction, accountability, and evaluation for each family's home school program. We also offer bi-weekly updates, parent meetings, field trips, school pictures, special activities, and other programs.

Prince George's Christian Academy Homeschool supervises individual programs of home instruction through operational guidelines, procedures, systems of accountability, and counseling adequate for program implementation and maintenance. The academy maintains the regular files and transcripts associated with normal academic procedures and acts as the official academic representative on behalf of each member's home school program. However, it is still the parents who must maintain legal and academic responsibility for the education of their children.

Oversight Includes:

- Pre-enrollment Conference: Offers insight and information about our program. Provides an opportunity for families to be interviewed.
- Central Record Keeping: Maintains office files including curriculum used, lesson plans, evaluations, standardized test scores, transcripts of grades, attendance, etc. The Academy also verifies instruction, facilitates transfer to other schools, and entrance into college.
- Personal Consultation: Offers recommendations for setting up a course of study based on the individual student's strengths, interests, and areas of special needs



Group Class Overview



Prince George's Christian Academy Homeschool offers **Group Classes** that are designed to support parents & guardians by providing core, Bible, and elective classes for students that will encourage character development and academic learning in a classroom setting. Students are provided a wholesome environment in which to interact with their peers and instructors.

- → It is important that your students are on time for class. If late, please enter quietly.
- → No cell phones are to be used during class time. Phones should be turned in following the school entry procedures.
- → Teachers, helpers, and coordinators will escort students throughout the building.
- → On-site students should report directly to their classrooms each morning.
- → Bathroom breaks will be allowed between classes. Excess walking throughout the building before, during, and after classes is prohibited.
- Parents are asked to provide their children with healthy bagged snacks/lunches, which include a drink. Please do not send red-colored drinks.
 They are difficult to clean out of the carpets.
- → PGCA Homeschool is not responsible for supplies and personal belongings that are left behind at the end of the day. Sometimes things are returned to the reception area.
- → Please encourage your students to keep track of their belongings (a backpack and lunch packs are essential).

Elementary School Classes


K –5th-grade group classes include core, Bible, and elective classes. Subjects are not self-contained (concepts and activities are taught with some at home assignments) and will motivate students in learning the subject matter.

Middle School Classes

6th –8th-grade group classes include core, Bible, and elective classes. Subjects are not self-contained and include weekly homework, classwork, assessments, & projects.

High School Classes

High school group classes for 9th -12th grade include core, Bible, and elective classes that feature homework, classwork, assessments, & projects.



Uniforms & Dress Code

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

TOPS – Prince George's Christian Academy official LOGO short-sleeve tee shirts, long-sleeve tee shirts, and hoodies.

BOTTOMS – Gray, black or navy-blue sweatpants or jeans or khakis.

- → NO distressed/ripped jeans.
- → NO shorts above the knee.
- → NO tight-fitting clothes.
- → NO inappropriate clothing, no inappropriate words on clothing.
- → NO do-rags or bonnets.
- → NO pajama pants or tops.
- → NO Slippers (e.g. house shoes, UGGS, etc.)
- → Clothes should not be so baggy that they are falling off the body.
- → Students must remove their hats in the building.
- → Virtual students must abide by the dress code and be in an appropriate learning space at the time of their online classes.
 Meaning their cameras should be ON at all times.

Standard of Expectations

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

GOAL: TO CONDUCT MYSELF AS IT CONCERNS SPEECH AND BEHAVIOR IN A MANNER THAT IS CHRIST-LIKE AND GLORIFIES GOD.

- → No name-calling, joning, poking fun, or talking about one another in a negative manner. Bullying will NOT be tolerated.
- \rightarrow No inappropriate clothing (refer to the dress code on the previous page).
- → No disrespectful speech or gestures towards authority.
- \rightarrow No boyfriend/girlfriend love relations.
- \rightarrow No inappropriate touching.
- → No fighting in words or actions. FIGHTING WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC SUSPENSION.
- \rightarrow No threats or bullying.
- \rightarrow No running or loud talking in the halls.
- ightarrow No students in unauthorized areas without adult supervision.
- → No exiting the instructional area without permission and/or supervision.
- ightarrow No accessing any academic spaces unsupervised during unauthorized time periods.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

Parents/guardians <u>must</u> inform their children of the expectations of the program regarding manners, conduct, and respect for tutors, administrators, parents/guardians, and one another while participating in Homeschool activities.

We have the heart to enforce and maintain Christian standards. We will address unacceptable behavior from the students. This includes verbal or physical abuse, harassment, damaging property, borrowing things without asking permission, or taking something that doesn't belong to you, telling untruths or misleading by exaggeration or omitting pertinent information, cheating, and any other unacceptable behavior.

Parents are responsible to work with teachers, tutors, and class administration concerning discipline problems

<u>Students who have chronic behavior issues may face termination from our program.</u> We believe this is necessary to maintain a safe and positive learning environment for all students.


